Maintenance Repair Hearing March 26, 2019 6:45 PM

Held remotely on Zoom and streamed on Facebook

Attended by: Bruce Murdock, Eric Welch, Robert Claus, Susan Repko, Kevin Kelly Superintendent Gratto, Danielle Fosella and Lisa DeZalia

Mr. Murdock opened the meeting at 6:45 pm

Mr. Gratto presented a slide show with the current information regarding the stair repair/replacement.

Unfortunately, safety concerns are necessitating repairs in the front of the school and on the north side of the school

- a. It will cost an estimated \$185,625 to remove the front steps and replace them with new steps that are historically appropriate for our building.
- b. It will cost an estimated \$55,000 to resurface the columns in front of the school
- c. It will cost an estimated \$15,000 to repair broken steps on the north side of the school

The board approved the budgeting of an extra \$62,675 under maintenance to be transferred to the capital fund to pay for part of this project. The \$62,675 will be added to the tax levy. The remainder of the cost of the repairs will be paid out of the repair reserve which currently holds \$309,648. Once the project is approved by the state, the project will go out for bid. Hopefully, the eventual cost will be less than the estimates.

A roll call vote will take place during the regular meeting immediately following the hearing.

BUDGET

PRESENTATION

Supt Gratto presented the draft budget in the amount of \$8,326,059.00 The Board will need to decide if they want to go over the tax cap or or if they would like to use \$530,000 of fund balance to make up the difference. After much discussion it was agreed that another budget

meeting would take place once the final state aid numbers were available.

POSITIONS DISCUSSED Mr. Gratto proposed placing an ad for a 12 month Bus Driver /Custodian at \$34,283 plus single health insurance. He also would like to place an ad for a 10 month cafeteria worker/bus driver at \$23,743 with single health insurance. By combining the two it reduces the custodial staff by 50% and

eliminates the summer cleaner. Mr. Claus was concerned with the custodial cuts and if the building would be adequately staffed. Mr. Gratto acknowledged his concern and stated that he was looking for ways to save the district money. The large use of fund balance was concerning to him.

Eric Welch stated that it might be time to look at the numbers and decide if it would be necessary to go over the tax cap. Perhaps it is better to go up in taxes gradually than all at once maybe next year. It was agreed that Mrs. Fossela would run the numbers using less fund balance and see what the tax rate would be. This will be discussed further at the next meeting

REPAIR

RESERVE ("District") is considering to undertake a project involving the main entrance stair replacement, north ramp repair and cast stone replacement. The stair replacement, ramp repair and cast stone replacement are part of the School District's effort to maintain their building as well as providing regular building maintenance and repairs to the existing K-12 building; the proposed project will include the removal of the existing concrete stairs, construction of a replacement stair including railings, repair of the existing ramp concrete; and removal and replacement of the deteriorating cast stone.

Whereas, the Board wishes to fully comply with its obligations under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and the regulations thereunder with respect to the proposed action; and

Whereas, upon review of the foregoing, the Board makes the following determinations:

- The proposed action involves the removal of the existing concrete stairs, construction of a replacement stair including railings, repair of the existing ramp concrete; and repair of the deteriorating cast stone to its existing K-12 school building.
- 2. The proposed project represents maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing facility or structure within the meaning of 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(1); and/or alternatively the replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility in kind within the meaning of 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(2); and/or alternatively a routine activity of an educational institution, including expansion of existing facilities by less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area, within the meaning of 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(8).
- 3. The proposed action will in no case have a significant adverse impact based on the environment based on the criteria contained in 6 NYCRR § 617.7(c), and is not otherwise a Type I action as defined by 6 NYCRR § 617.4.
- 4. The proposed action is a Type II action within the meaning of 6 NYCRR 617.5 and is therefore not subject to review under SEQRA and the regulations thereunder.
- 5. The District is hereby authorized to undertake the necessary work as described

above and to expend an amount from its Maintenance and Repair fund not to exceed \$256,170.00 The Project will be financed by the District's Maintenance and Repair Fund. The expenditure for this project will utilize the District' procurement procedures including public bidding.

Any unused funds not utilized for the Stair Repair/Replacement and Cast Stone Replacement project shall be returned to the District's Maintenance and Repair Fund. The Superintendent of Schools and all officers and authorized employees of the District are hereby authorized and directed to take all steps reasonably necessary or appropriate to complete the Project and to carry out the intent of this Resolution and to apply for any eligible State Aid available through the New York State Education Department.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board finds and concludes that the proposed action is a Type II action within the meaning of 6 NYCRR 617.5 and therefore is not subject to review under SEQRA and the regulations thereunder.
